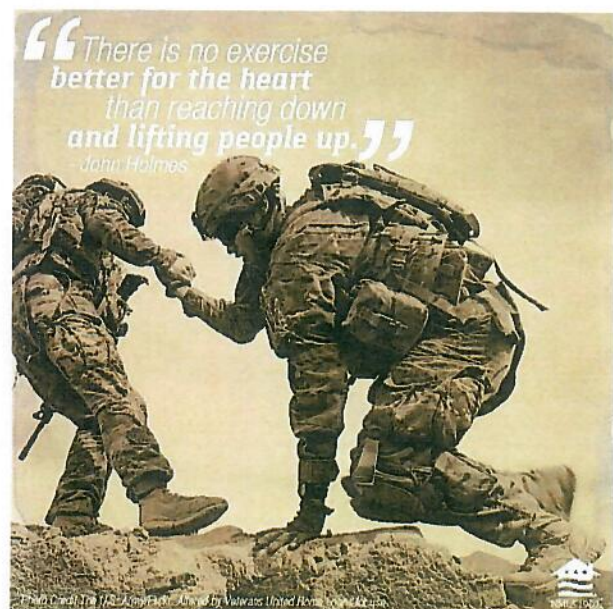

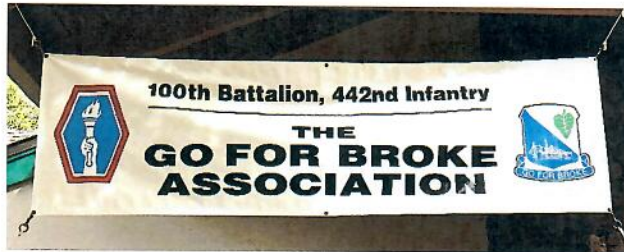

25th Annual Go For Broke Golf Tournament

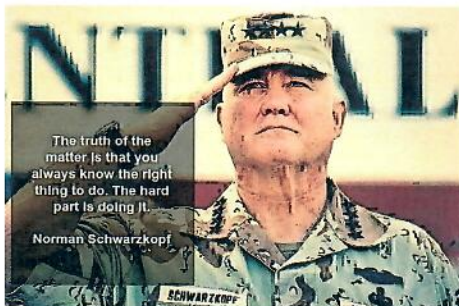
